It has been my pleasure to serve the Silverdale Water District for 22 years and I am more amazed every month to see the growth we have accomplished and how proud I am to know that we have some of the best water in the state to offer our customers. Now we look toward the future in how we can serve your children and grandchildren. Kitsap County, and the Silverdale area in particular, will continue to experience more rapid growth because we are a very desirable place to live. This will also continue to put a strain on our natural resources, particularly water.

Your water district, in cooperation with the Kitsap Public Utility District, is in a continuing search for new resources. At this point we are jointly conducting studies through the use of flow tests and test wells to determine the size of what appears to be a very large aquifer near Klahowya Secondary School. We have jointly installed a 16 inch water main from the Klahowya tank to our reservoir on Dickey Road, near Silverdale Water District and Central Kitsap Fire and Rescue headquarters. The new resource will provide for the thirsty north end of Kitsap County and Central Kitsap projected growth.

However, in spite of our development of new resources, we should all keep in mind the importance of conservation and the embracing of exciting new membrane technology that could result in the reuse of non-potable water for irrigation, watering your yard, and other non-personal uses.

Many areas of our country are in dire distress because of lack of water and are on the verge of drought. We want you to know that our pledge to you is that we will always continue to provide the best water with the most advanced technology available to us. Thank you for giving us the opportunity to serve you. We will always be there to answer your questions and serve your needs.

Conservation Tips

Efficient water use can save you money on water & utility bills, and reduce the costs for sewer and septic services. Use the following household tips in the bathroom, kitchen and laundry room to help protect the environment and save your family money!

Check faucets, pipes, and toilets for leaks.

Each flush wastes water. Don't use the toilet as a wastebasket.

Reduce the water level per flush by installing a low-flow toilet or a toilet displacement device.

Don't let the bathroom sink run while wetting your toothbrush, brushing your teeth or when shaving.

Use both sides of the sink when washing dishes by hand; one side to wash and the other side to rinse. Do not wash dishes under a running faucet.

In-sink garbage disposal devices use roughly 11.5 gallons of water each day.

Try composting organic wastes instead of throwing them away.

Use the proper water level, load size selection and water temperature when washing clothes.

What is a WaterPAK?

Silverdale Water District believes that cooperation between similar public organizations often leads to better service and function. This is the idea behind Water Purveyor's Association of Kitsap or WaterPAK. WaterPAK, formed in 1993, is an organization made up of water purveyors, and other related agencies with the goal to:



- Gather and disseminate information regarding water utility service and water resources.
- Advise Kitsap County and other appropriate governmental officials concerning water issues and standards.
- Actively participate in water related public education activities to educate the citizens of Kitsap County about water quality, resource conservation, and other issues.
- Establish a network of communication for interested water purveyors.
- Support implementation of and recommend changes to the Kitsap County Coordinated Water System Plan which is updated every 6 years.

These goals are met through a variety of activities from holding a monthly meeting where water purveyors can share information to participating in local community events which provides the venue for educating the public about water conservation and quality. In an effort to disseminate information often a speaker is invited to give a presentation at the monthly WaterPAK meeting. Presenters range from Geo Scientists, representatives from US EPA, educators, leaders from similar agencies, and individual water utilities.

WaterPAK also address the wide range of issues that face water purveyors by creating task forces that focus on one area of related issues. These include Legislative Issues, Cross Connection Control, Wellhead Protection, Water Conservation, Emergency Management, Public Education, Water and Fire Issues, and Finance.

→ A Bit of History

On February 11, 1936, Silverdale Water District acquired property from the Jackson Hall Memorial Association to construct a recreational community center in Silverdale. The District received funding from the Works Progress Administrations to construct two concrete dams on the 25-acre water shed property and to construct a community hall (Jackson Hall – log building located in Old Town Silverdale).
